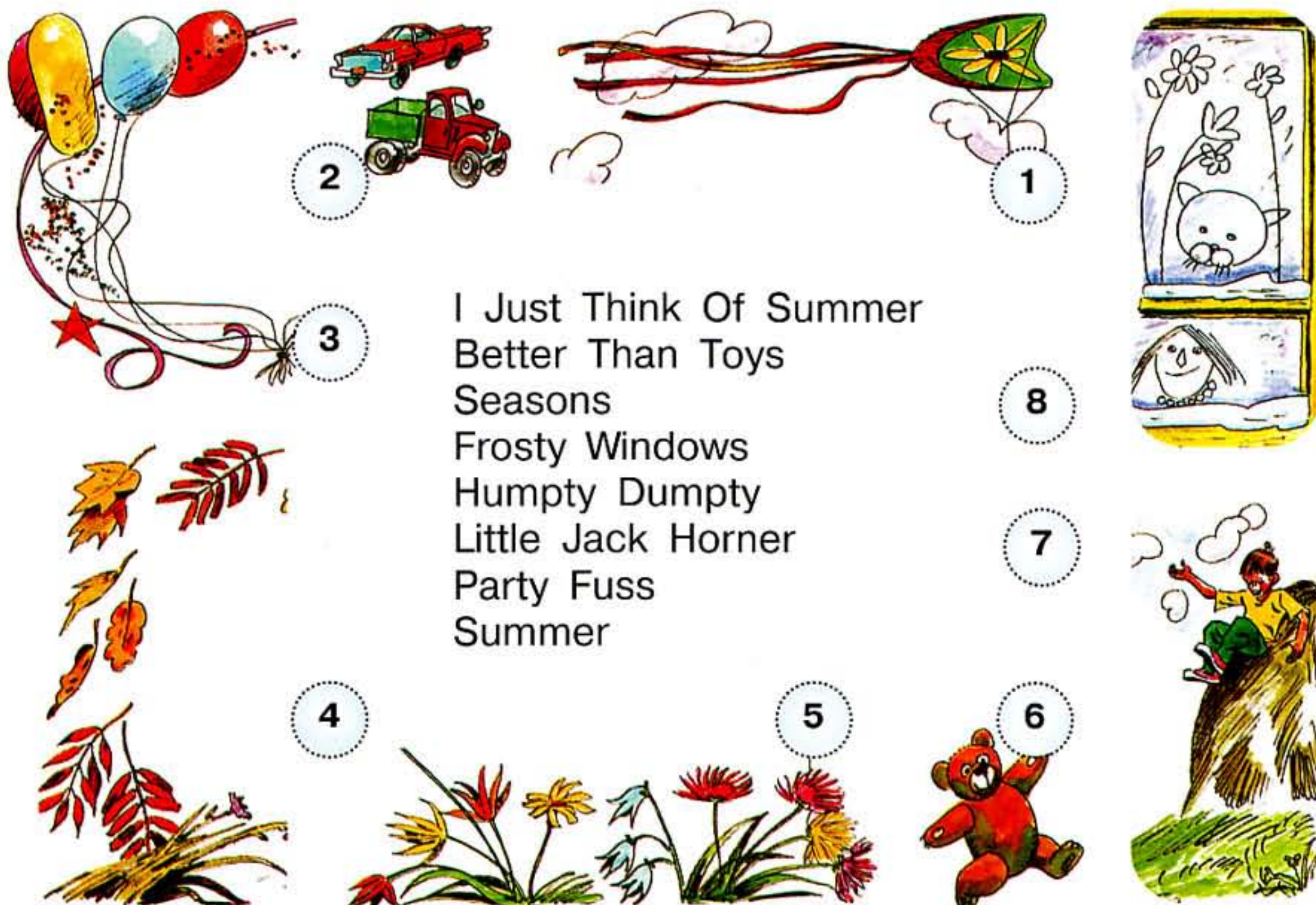


My Favourite Stories And Poems
